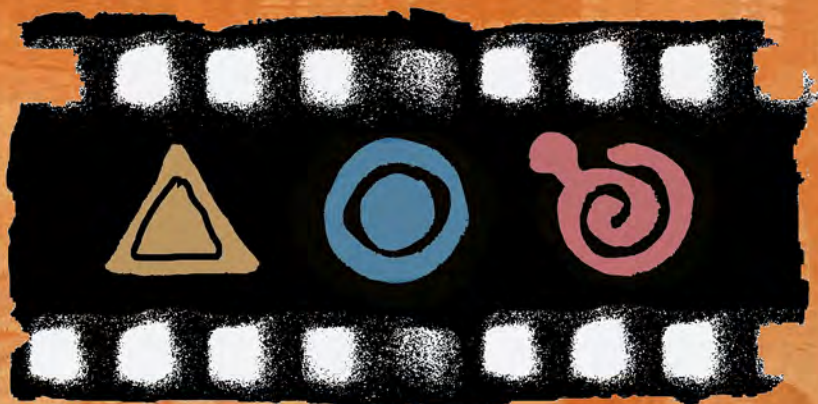

Pittsburgh, PA – Jean F Guilleux, **Arkhaios Film Festival** founder, and Phillip Mendenhall, co-founder of the **Archaeological Gems of Pittsburgh**, have announced the creation of The **Arkhaios Cultural Heritage and Archaeology Conference and Film Festival** in Pittsburgh, PA. It will take place on October 27 and 28, 2017 at the Frick Fine Arts Building on the University of Pittsburgh campus.

Arkhaios Film Festival is in its fifth year of operations presenting a juried film competition “The Arkhaios Cultural Heritage and Archaeological Film Festival” yearly in Hilton Head Island, SC and this year in Columbia, SC on the University of South Carolina campus. The **Archaeological Gems of Pittsburgh**, now in its second year, will celebrate Archaeology Month by hosting, each day of the festival, presentations by representatives from local organizations, and University of Pittsburgh students and staff, on their on-going archaeological work throughout the region. Films documenting archaeological and cultural projects from around the world from this year’s Arkhaios Film Festival award winners will follow the presentations. The Festival will start each day at 2pm. It is a free event open to the public.

The Arkhaios Cultural Heritage and Archaeology Film Festival is an annual educational event showcasing the discovery of past cultures gained from archaeological research and illustrated by documentary films.
